Proclamations are discretionary public announcements directing attention to a local resident, organization, or event. Proclamations typically are issued for certain events or causes when such a proclamation positively impacts the community and conveys an affirmative message to residents. The Mayor, without formal action of the City Council, may approve and issue proclamations.

Requests for proclamations should be submitted at least two weeks in advance.
